Kenji Joe Otsuka was born in 1914 in the city of Los Angeles, California. He was the son of a Japanese immigrant and an American woman. He served in the United States Army during World War II, where he was assigned to the Military Intelligence Service. He was captured by the Japanese in 1942 and spent the remainder of the war in a prisoner-of-war camp. After the war, he returned to the United States and continued his education. He is a member of the Japanese American National Museum and the Japanese American Veterans Association.
